## J. Didrick Obituary

**J** Bradenton, Florida - J Barton Didrick, 86, of Bradenton, FL, passed away peacefully on October 20, 2022, after a short illness.

Bart was born in Lima, Ohio, on July 18, 1936, to Dana and Marguerite Didrick. He attended grade school in Grover Hill, Ohio, spent 2 years attending Otterbein College, graduated from the Cincinnati College of Embalming in 1957, graduated from Ohio State University in 1961, and Ohio State University Dental College in 1965.
